CITY TEAMS WITH SOLAR GARDEN CO.

In June, the city council heard from US Solar who provides solar energy "subscriptions." The company is building a solar array that will provide energy to the city at a rate pennies below Xcel's rate. The difference is the subscription locks in the initial rate for the next 25 years. The city saves substantial sums if the cost of energy increases...as it seems to do. The net gain could be as much as \$98,000 over the course of the contract. The potential loss would be if energy rates decrease and stay low. Historically, that has not been the case. If all goes as planned, the subscription will start next summer.

As the double yellow lines get painted on our roads this fall, I wanted to share some exciting news from the 2017 MN Legislative Session. Thanks to lobbying from The Bicycle Alliance of Minnesota, a new state law went into effect in May, 2017. It allows drivers to pass cyclists when safe to do so in a no-passing zone, like Cedar St./Hall Ave. While many people naturally move over and allow the legal three feet of passing zone when passing bikers and walkers, we can now feel lawful about doing it.

Since this goes against what was taught in driver's education courses, I'd encourage you all to share this new law with friends and family so that everyone can safely share the roads as get around town.

(Note that Association rules still apply to dock use. This membership covers personal use only. It is not permitted to tie/attach any boats or other watercraft to the docks or shore at any time. MAYOR'S NOTES by Mary Wingfield

The city council recently asked the Birchwood Dock Association to solve the problem of city residents being asked to leave the beach docks because they are non-members. The lake access beaches are the city's best resource and it was frustrating to hear this was happening. Fortunately, the Dock Association worked to solve this issue so that EVERY resident of Birchwood can use the docks, yet still keeping the docks "private". This will be a huge improvement and resolves a problem that has been festering too long.

The solution seems simple, but the process was difficult. One of the things pointed out to me was that the solution could have been sorted out with all parties before coming out publicly with a solution. That is how business gets done in the real world. Unfortunately, government open meeting laws do not allow that.

Councilmembers and the mayor may only speak to one other member about any city issue. Nor can that conversation be transmitted to a third council member for an update or input without violating the open meeting law. This means that a council will never be able to sort out the direction it decides to go except at a council meeting. Nor can it do any investigation or preliminary work as a body.

As mayor, ideas or concerns get presented to me in hopes they can be addressed somehow. Usually, that results in doing some fact finding and then presenting the information for public discussion. It's like watching sausage being made—not always pretty, especially on matters that are emotional.

Regardless, the council and I, through the city administrator, will continue to work with residents as issues come up. A thorough discussion with all does result in the best outcome. I look forward to working with you and our council and committees to continue to make improvements on our community. m
