GREETINGS FROM MAYOR MARGARET

What a summer! This is a shoutout to the community that came together to clear the roads after that, as my neighbor Paul described it, a "really scary, go in the basement, storm" of July 19. On my drive home from my mother's 91st birthday party, I wasn't prepared for the huge tree that had been blown over to completely block Birchwood Avenue. I squeezed past the tree and walked towards the cheerful sound of chainsaws, and found Steve Dean and Andy Sorensen sawing and bucking up another huge tree further down across the road, while neighbors helped stack the debris on the shoulder while sharing their melting ice cream sandwiches. There were more trees down on Wildwood and Grotto, Tighe-Schmitz and more! By 11PM the roads were emergency accessible. Work continued through the weekend. I know many of

you also have cleanup challenges. Huge thanks to Steve Dean who volunteered his expert services on behalf of Birchwood. We do have large piles of wood stacked on the roadsides. We appreciate your patience while we chip away at removal. Jim Rydeen is working on this. Thanks to Jim. Also, Thanks to Kathy Weier for organizing neighborhood volunteers to move limbs into manageable piles and future trailer loading opportunities. We are looking into hiring a vendor, if needed, to get the big trunks cut and brush piles picked up before the snow flies. If you want firewood, grab it now. I know many have helped in the cleanup process. This is how it happens when we come together!

While it's wonderful to live in an arboretum, it's a challenge to manage storms and the diseases that arise. Many thanks to Bridget Sperl for representing Birchwood at the DNR forestry seminar. She received information about how we can apply for grants to have ash trees removed and others planted. More as we learn.

Speaking of storms, who got soaked at the Fourth of July parade? Or should I ask, who didn't! While it sadly cut the festivities short, I'm sure we'll all have a memory of the Gully Washer Fourth. The band under the leadership of Michael Lien was excellent and thanks to Tori Wormwood for a beautiful solo. Kudos to the Community Club and all who marched and volunteered. Bravo to Randy Lafoy who replaced the flag in Wildwood park. The media has reached out to do a story on our parade. I'll find out more and give everyone an update next spring. Birchwood is having a moment!

The other events from this summer are far less dramatic. We've had some serious potholes problems that are being addressed in two ways. For now, we've been focused on patching and repairing the best we can given budgets and vendor availability. Going forward, Marcus Johnson, our city engineer, is doing a road survey project using imaging technology which will address repair/replacement systematically. This will help us formulate a comprehensive plan to allow data based long term budgeting. We are applying for grants to help fund these street improvements.

We are moving forward on the lift station replacement. This is a required infrastructure upgrade. We have \$600,000 in public funding put in place by the efforts of Mary Wingfield and Rep Betty McCollum's team as well as money from the Rice Creek Watershed District to offset some of the costs on this project.

I've enjoyed my office hours. I learn many helpful things from your visits. The theme from these conversations is that we are proud of Birchwood in different ways and we all call Birchwood a wonderful home.
