On December 8th at approximately 1pm, contract deputies responded to White Pine Lane on a reported mail theft that occurred 40 minutes prior.

The victim was advised by her neighbor that he saw someone open her mailbox and take a package from it. The deputy spoke with the witness, who said a female in a maroon-colored Chevrolet Tahoe exited the vehicle and stole the package.

The witness was able to get a picture of the vehicle's license plate and provide it to law enforcement. No other mailbox thefts have been reported in this area.
