#### **MAYOR'S NOTES**

Despite the apparent doldrums of winter, much has been going on behind the scenes at city hall. The Centennial committee has been scouring old files looking for tidbits of information. It is fun to find rabbit holes to go down. Sometimes they enlighten how we got where we are; other times, they connect dots about who's who and the names that appear on signs and in records but don't have a connection any more.

Sara Markoe Hanson of the White Bear Lake Historical Society has been helping our group make those connections. We have one grant and are applying for more grants to create historical signage to memorialize those who provided the foundation for our community. That work is ongoing with a goal of an event celebrating our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary on September 10<sup>th</sup>.

This group has also been working on a centennial booklet (see article on this page). A booklet was done in the 1950s and for the country's Bicentennial. This will be a nice addition to our collection. And we are looking for pictures. Let me know if you have anything to share or would like to be a part of this group.

The building group has been making tracks as well. As part of that research, I was in the city archives trying to find the original plans for the village hall to help the building task force learn more about the historical value. I found the original specs handbook, but no exterior or first floor plans, but I did find two plans for alternative designs that were considered. In my mind, those designs were reminiscent of the lodge up at Itasca State Park. A large dining room and men's and women's sitting rooms were included, while the council chambers appeared to be an afterthought and quite small. I suspect the plans were too fancy for the times and our predecessors chose the rather simple hall that was actually built...for a total of \$3900. The land was an additional \$661.40.

All our work has been done via zoom, phone calls and emails, which can be a challenge. It will be nice to get back to normal sooner rather than later. We are getting there together. Stay safe and have a pleasant spring. m

### KAYAK/CANOE RACK INFORMATION

You must register your boat and obtain a permit sticker before selecting a spot on a rack and storing your boat. All boats must be registered or they will be removed. Fee is \$35 per boat. The council has waived the fee for anyone whose household Adjusted Gross Income is less than \$35,000 (with proof via federal tax document; one waiver per address)

#### SPRING LEAF PICK UP

The city will again provide for spring leaf pick up. Road signs will be put out at the entrances into town the week prior to the pick-up weekend. For more info check www. CityofBirchwood.com. You must RSVP for this service. Please call city hall to register. If you use the service multiple times, you will be billed for each pick up. If you put your leaves on city property/parks/open space, you will be billed triple the fee.

### VILLAGE HALL UPDATE

You will soon be seeing the cedar siding removed from the village hall. This will reveal the original 1932 façade. The cedar siding was put up in the 1970s. It has sustained drainage and rot problems. And the woodpeckers have been busy doing a number on it as well. The Building Restoration task force submitted this recommendation so we can make the exterior weather and water tight for the next 100 years.

The task force also has recommended that the runoff around the building be corrected. Right now, runoff seeps into the office. Once the outside issues are addressed, the task force will concentrate on interior improvements. Stay tuned.
