TIGHE-SCHMITZ PARK PUBLIC FORUM

We are excited to announce our next public forum focusing on the future of Tighe-Schmitz Park! We have been working closely with representatives from the Washington Conservation District and Rice Creek Watershed District to learn more about the park, future planning, and potential grant opportunities to help fund new projects.

The public forum is tentatively scheduled for **Saturday**, **May 18th at 10:00AM at City Hall.** Additional notification will be communicated by the city. The forum will focus on a history of the use of Tighe-Schmitz Park, solicit the public for ideas and preferences for the park, and describe potential grant programs available. Representatives from the Washington Conservation District will be present to answer questions from the public.

WATER CONSERVATION

Water conservation during our summer months is important, especially with the little snowfall this winter and generally dryer summers we have had that fill our lakes and replenish groundwater resources. Residents are reminded that, by ordinance (201.440), irrigation restrictions are mandated for the warmer months (May 1 - September 30) for all properties within Birchwood Village. Watering **cannot** occur from 10:00AM to 5:00PM, per city ordinance. This is especially important with our frequent drought conditions.

SEEKING VOLUNTEERS!

Many in our community have offered to help maintain our parks and beaches. Please be on the lookout for a new posting on the city's website with a spreadsheet listing various tasks that anyone can volunteer to complete. All volunteers will be required to sign a waiver for the work they are signing up for and will work closely with city staff or committee members to fully understand the task. The spreadsheet will be updated periodically to reflect new and completed tasks. Thanks for your help in keeping our community beautiful!

NEW SIGNS AT PARKS AND BEACHES

We have been working in conjunction with city council to update the beach and park signs to reflect new changes in the city code (Chapter 607). The new signs are expected to be installed in the spring at all city parks and beaches. Please be aware that per city code (607.216), dogs will be allowed at all beaches and parks, with the exception of Kay Beach, and must be leashed at all times. No dogs are permitted at Kay Beach at any time due to it being a designated swimming beach. Smoking and motorized vehicles will not be allowed at any park or beach.

THE WINTER THAT ALMOST WAS!

The mild winter spared us the usual plowing challenges associated with heavy snowfall. At the time of this writing, we are well within our snow care budget. We'll brace ourselves for March.

The skating season has been short and sweet. Thanks to Jim Rydeen for managing the rinks during this challenging weather. Also thanks to all who volunteered to improve the rink.

I'm also happy to announce that we've had only one water main break to date. Thanks to John Manship for his careful investigation and quick action ensuring the reliability of our water infrastructure.

While we did encounter an emergency repair situation at two of our sewer lift stations, our swift response and action prevented any disruptions to or failure of service.

I'm pleased to share that progress on the construction of a new sewer lift station is well underway. We are in the final stages of approval of our plans and are putting the project out for construction bids.

I'm happy to share that two task forces are forming. One to assess the feasibility, costs and benefits of a bike path in Birchwood. This initiative aligns with our commitment to promoting alternative transportation methods, enhancing community for all residents.

The second task force is for improving road safety. These groups will share ideas to land on the best recommendations for our community.
