INTRODUCING: CRIMEVIEW ANALYTICS

Professional sports teams aren't the only ones interested in using analytics: The Sheriff's Office has recently added CrimeView Analytics to its crime-fighting arsenal. This powerful software program, which is now available to Washington County law enforcement agencies, pulls data from the computer-aided dispatch and the law enforcement records management system and provides information that can create reports and charts to spot trends and understand crime patterns — even identifying frequent contacts and locations. Heat maps generated by CrimeView can help visualize these incidents, using color gradients to quickly show where clusters of incidents, traffic stops, citations, and arrests are happening countywide, in individual cities or in specific neighborhoods within those cities. As the system is ramping up, the focus is on equipping the Community Impact Unit with the new tools first, to help with upcoming saturation efforts. "We expect this data to show us patterns that will help us solve more cases and prevent more crime by giving us new ways to strategize and prioritize," said Chief Deputy Doug Anschutz.

And while CrimeView Analytics is available only to law enforcement, Washington County residents can view incidents and receive alerts in a sister program that was rolled out last year, called [CrimeMapping.com](https://www.crimemapping.com). We encourage city officials to check it out and to let their residents know about it.

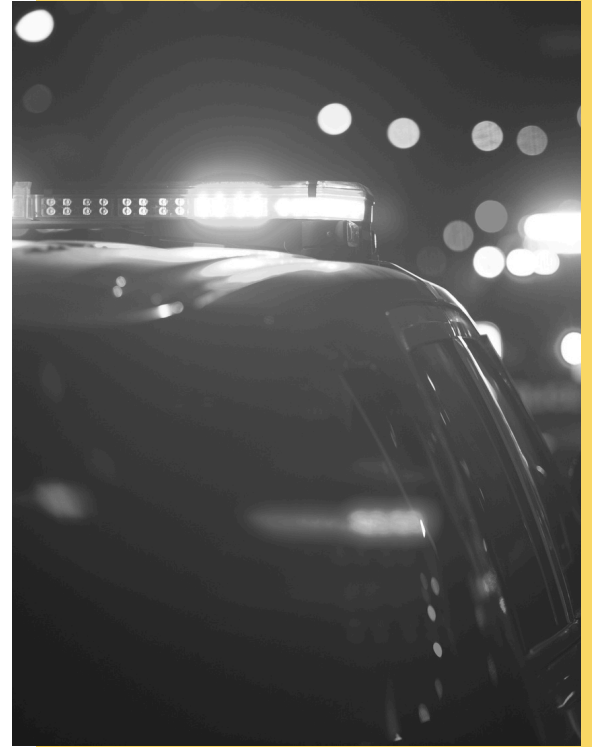

At 11:15pm on Feb. 25, a deputy spoke with a resident who reported receiving a call on their home landline at around 9:55pm. The person on the call said the resident's Amazon account had been compromised. There were supposedly 18 addresses found under the resident's name, and these addresses were said to be receiving packages containing drugs and fraud. The resident was transferred to a what was allegedly a Social Security Administration line. The resident was told that the SSA needed information about assets and needed to change the resident's Social Security number. further, if these tasks weren't completed by the next day a warrant would be issued for the resident. The resident was told to expect follow-up communication the next day. The resident didn't provide any account numbers or other sensitive information, and no money was lost. The deputy provided a case number and advised the resident not to answer any follow-up phone calls or provide any information.



MESSAGE FROM THE SHERIFF

The numbers are staggering: In 2024, there were 472 lives lost related to motor vehicle crashes on Minnesota roads. That's up from 402 in 2023 and 444 in 2022. This includes pedestrians and bicyclists, and they range from children to young drivers to seniors. As of this letter, we're already up to 45 in 2025. For anyone who has experienced losing a loved one in a crash, we want you to know that we feel for you and know the tragic effects it can have on families, individuals, communities — even businesses.

While the choices drivers make to stay sober, wear seatbelts, put down their cellphones and other distractions make a huge difference in these kinds of statistics, we're also doing our best to keep roads safe. On one Friday night alone last month, the new Community Impact Unit stopped a vehicle traveling southbound on Hwy 61 at more than 100mph — more than twice the legal limit. Another deputy stopped a DWI traveling 20mph over the speed limit in the same area. CIU tagged three vehicles going more than 95mph in a 60mph zone that night. Thanks for making a difference, CIU, and to all you drivers: Please stay safe!
